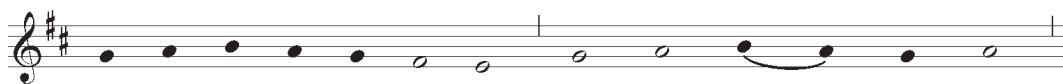

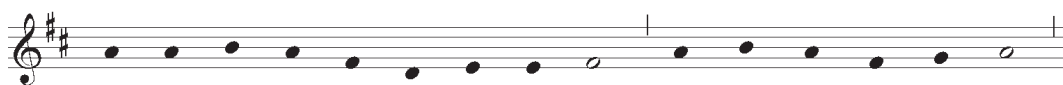

In this passage, the prophet Jeremiah brings a word from God to the people of Israel in exile in Babylon, promising them that one day they will return to the land of Israel.

Introduction to the Epistle Reading

As we continue in our reading from the Letter to the Hebrews, the author continues to compare Jesus with the priests of the Temple period, making the case that Jesus's death was a one-time sacrifice that did not need to be repeated like the sacrifices of the Temple priests.

Hebrews 7:23-28

New Revised Standard Version (NRSV)

The former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office; but Jesus holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues forever. Consequently he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them.

For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect forever.

The Communion

Communion will be distributed in one kind only, the bread (wafer). Gluten free wafers are available; they are in a separate gold container on the paten (plate) where the wafers are.

If you are participating online and you have a consecrated wafer, please consume it now. If you do not have a consecrated wafer, you can say this Prayer for Spiritual Communion instead:

“In union, O Lord, with the faithful of St. John’s, where the Holy Eucharist is now being celebrated, I desire to offer you praise and thanksgiving. I present to you my soul and body, with the earnest wish that I may always be united to you. And since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I beseech you to come spiritually into my heart. I unite myself with you and embrace you with all the love of my soul. Let nothing ever separate you from me. May I live in you, and may you live in me, both in this life and in the life to come. Amen.”
