give yourself the gift of being authentic to yourself


it's okay to not be okay during Christmas

Let it be beside you, around you, within you as you face what your life has to offer.


Remember that in your best times it was love that brought you the joy you have known, And in your worst times it was love that sustained your hope against all odds.
